Recipe – Try This One...



Carmel apple Muffins...



Prep: 25 min. Bake:20 min.

Makes 1 doz.

2 cups all-purpose flour

¾ cup sugar

2 tsp. baking powder

2 ½ tsp. ground cinnamon

½ tsp. salt

1 large egg, room temp.

1 cup 2% milk

¼ cup butter, melted

2 tsp. vanilla extract

½ cup chopped peeled tart apples

12 caramels, chopped

Toppings...

½ cup packed brown sugar

¼ cup quick-cooking oats

1 tsp. ground cinnamon

3 tbsp. Butter - melted

1. Combine the dry ingredients. In another bowl, whisk egg, milk, butter and vanilla. Stir into the dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in apple and caramels.
2. Fill 12 paper-lined muffin cups three-fourths full. Combine toppings, sprinkle over batter.
3. Bake at 350o until a toothpick inserted in the cake portion comes out clean,20-25 min. Cool for 5 minutes before removing.
